## STUDENT LEARNING CONFERENCES



All families have a Student Learning Conference scheduled for tomorrow, **Thursday 30th July**. Students are only required at school during their Student Learning Conference. **DO NOT** attend your child's Student Learning Conference if you are unwell, you can reschedule. Physical distancing **MUST** be adhered to whilst on school grounds. Please arrive no more than 5 minutes prior to your scheduled time, but **be on time**. Hand sanitizer will be used when entering the school. Conferences must stick to schedule and not run over time, this is to avoid multiple families waiting in the corridor. If you need more time, a follow up phone call can be arranged for another day. We ask that **NO pre-school age siblings come to the conferences**. We know this may be difficult to arrange, however the conferences need to stay focused on the learning of students in order to stick to time and teachers will need to clean between conferences. I know you will understand that cleaning everything a toddler touches during the conferences is not practical when we are pressed for time and trying to maintain the schedule. Please leave the school grounds immediately following your child's Conference. **It is important that we follow these restrictions to ensure that our Student Learning Conferences can occur safely for everyone involved**.
