Reader's Workshop Instructional Model

Whole class reading strategy Part One 5-10 mins

mini lesson

Purposeful reading tasks



Students participate in small group reading activities or whole class reading tasks. Small group focused teaching can include: Language Experience (for pre-readers), Small Group Shared Reading, Guided Reading, Reciprocal Teaching and Literature Circles.

Part Four 5-10 mins



Students report on the reading strategies they used during the session. Sometimes our reflection is whole class, sometimes students "turn and talk" to a peer about their reading.
